




### The Horizons Project:

# **Major Highlights**



### **The Horizons Project:**

- 26 Initiatives Funded
- \$31,006,000 Allocated Funding
- 50% Initiatives Completion Rate
- 155% Projected Financial Benefit
- Other Benefits: Enhanced teaching and research capacity, community engagement, strengthened administrative capacity, and growth in entrepreneurial thinking
- All initiatives were funded by the Government of Saskatchewan Ministry of Advanced Education and approved by the President's Executive Committee (PEC)



# **Progress Update**



# Total of 26 initiatives received investment (one completed and one discontinued leaving a total of 24 ongoing initiatives)

- 70% (18) of the initiatives are currently On Track and progressing towards the intended outcomes within the expected timeframe
- Five initiatives have seen Temporary Delays
  - supply chain issues or challenges in recruiting required personnel to launch and operationalize the initiative
  - In all instances these delays have now been rectified
- Two initiatives have seen Major Delays
- One initiatives has been Completed
